## RESOLUTION TO RESTORE 150 MILLION IN MUNICIPAL AID -

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF VICTORY GARDENS CALLING FOR GOVERNOR MURPHY TO RESTORE \$150 MILLION IN MUNICIPAL AID THAT WAS ELIMINATED

- WHEREAS, the State FY 2025 Appropriations Act eliminated a \$150 million municipalities category known as the "Municipal Relief Fund" and
- WHEREAS, the elimination of the Municipal Relief Fund would otherwise be reflected in municipal budgets in the Spring of 2025; and
- WHEREAS, State Aid reductions will exacerbate the impact of inflation and State mandates as more particularly set forth in the attached letter from Senator Bucco to Governor Murphy:
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Victory Gardens, that the Governor is requested to propose fully restoring \$150 million of aid for the Municipal Relief Fund in the State budget he next presents to the Legislature and allow municipalities to anticipate the aid as part of the CY 2025 budgets

a copy of this Resolution to the Governor.

Jim Janone - My flier was on my lawn and it was all wet by the time I got it. Mine was in my mailbox. Who is our CFO? Right now it is Joe. Jason is our Treasurer. Come January our CFO will be Jason. What do we get in Municipal Aid? I'm not sure. It could be around \$75,000. Are we done with the BOE litigation? No. The Attorney said he has a conference with the Judge next week. We have an issue with the money we are holding back. Also, we are waiting to go over the debt service issues. The Clerk said we released a lot of money to them but the Attorney said we are still holding about \$600,000. We are paying the monthly amount but not paying the debt service. If we were paying the debt service, how much more a month would that be? Maybe around \$8,000 more. We had a meeting last night with the BOE and they said there is no reason why they can't give a list of names to the Clerk. They are supposed to be working on it. They will mark it Confidential so it doesn't go anywhere else. I also told them at the meeting that the bus drivers are not checking bus passes and that we have kids from Salem Village coming up into VG and riding the buses. They said they will check into that. I sent them the emails for both Debbe and Letty.

The Clerk said she doesn't know if anyone else notices this or not, but we have kids at the bus stop at the firehouse and at Polk. I followed the bus around one day and it seems, especially on Washington that they stop at practically every house. Jefferson is a stop and the apartments are a stop. Councilman

Suarez said he noticed it also.

Councilman Lorenzo siad he notices about 6 buses dropping kids off in here. I only see 1 or 2 kids on the whole bus. I know, the Clerk said that we have a bus for the high school then there is one or two for East Dover and North Dover. The Clerk said we asked Dover about this several times because we get

complaints that the buses aren't full and why are there so many in here.

Councilwoman Hedgepath said that the high school kids get picked up at 6:49 a.m..

Are we doing anything withthe Cannabis In Kind gift that Joe talked about. He was supposed to let us know what Wharton was doing. I don't think you can do that the Clerk said until they actually move in. Tangerine is no where getting where they are moving in. The other place, has the permits. He is working over there. He also said that he was soing to have a job foir to him from the town. there. He also said that he was going to have a job fair to hire from the town if they can. See if we can find out when he will be opening.

Councilwoman Hedgepath said that the bus schedule is A thru G and there

are 7 stops.
